Handprint Flower

Supplies Needed:

- paper straws
- construction paper
- non-toxic paint (optional)
- green paper for leaves
- washi tape and glue
- scissors

Instructions:

- 1. Trace child's hand on construction paper and cut it out.
 - a. Note: Dipping the child's hand in non-toxic paint and pressing on white paper is another way to make handprint roses.
- 2. Place the handprint paper on the top 1/3 of the straw. Be sure it is centered.
- 3. Secure straw to the handprint with tape.
- Cut leaf shapes out of green construction paper, gluing one end to straw. (see picture)
 - a. Wrap leaf shape around straw to spread glue out and help it dry faster.
 - b. If you have time, repeat steps to make a mini bouquet!
