Puffy Paint Ice Cream Cone*

*or another object to fit the lesson



Supplies:

- Food Coloring
- Glue bottle
- Shaving Cream
- White cardstock paper
- Brown Construction or Foam paper
- Scissors
- Markers
- Paintbrush
- Toothpicks or spoons for stirring
- Styrofoam Bowls
- Sprinkles (optional)

Instructions:

- 1. Give each person a Styrofoam bowl and mixing utensil. Put equal parts shaving cream and glue into each bowl and have them mix until peaks form.
- 2. Add food coloring into bowls (2 drops per person)
- 3. Using brown construction or foam paper, have the children cut out a triangle to make their "cone." They can make it a waffle cone and draw diagonal lines from both sides (see picture) or leave it as is.
- 4. Glue cone onto white cardstock paper and the have each person write their name on the back of the paper. The puffy paint might get a little messy on the front, so having their name on the back will help later on!
- 5. Using a paintbrush or fingers, have the children paint the puffy paint onto the cone in ice-cream scoop shapes.
- 6. Add sprinkles and draw a cherry on top for fun, then put away to dry!

Optional Devotional:

We took a lot of time on making our ice cream cones look delicious, didn't we? This reminds me of Psalm 139:14, which says "I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made; your works are wonderful, I know that full well." This verse reminds us that we are handcrafted by God; that he has made us to be just how we are, and we are so loved by Him! Imagine how much more God loves you, His handiwork!
